The programme also showcased a very beautifully curated Mushaira titled Bazm E Khayal with performers Gouri Chug, Tasneef Haidar, Vikas Sharma Raaz, Vipul Kumar moderated by Azhar Iqbal.

Other prominent panelist of the event were Aquib Sabir, Imtiyaz Khan, Asiya Zahoor, Harris Qadeer, Ayesha Manira, Sanaya, Tasheef Haider, Heena Kausar and Tanzil Rahman.
