31st July August 2019, New Delhi: The Oxford Bookstore Book Cover Prize celebrated its fifth edition with its new jury announcement at a beautiful literary gathering hosted at The Park, New Delhi by Priti Paul and Namita Gokhale.

Oxford Bookstore Book Cover Prize's new jury comprises of **Shobhaa De** prominent Author, Indian columnist and novelist, **Shashi Tharoor**, well known Indian politician, writer and Member of Parliament, Feroze Gujral renowned Indian philanthropist, art patron, businesswoman, model and columnist besides **Priti Paul** Director, Apeejay Surrendra Group and the creative force behind Oxford Bookstores and **Namita Gokhale** author, publisher & literary historian.

The jury members are all pre-eminent in their particular fields and share a love and commitment to books and reading. *The varied interests of these* eminent jurors will help create a rich and diverse perspective for the selection.

Instituted in March 2015 by Oxford Bookstore, the Oxford Bookstore Book Cover Prize year after year has gained traction as the most prestigious award in the book cover design industry. It is a first of its kind award for brilliance in book design, an attempt by the iconic bookstore to recognize and encourage the extraordinary work of illustrators, designers and publishers across India. The prize appreciates the importance of the balance of graphics and narrative, particularly in our increasingly visual age, and believes that a book cover interprets and decodes the ensuing text in crucial ways that contribute to its ultimate success.

Under the guidance of Ms. Priti Paul, Director, Apeejay Surrendra Group, Oxford Bookstores has been pushing all boundaries to encourage the publishing industry and celebrate the business of books. Standout cover design is an integral part of the success of a book, designers and illustrators play a vital role in helping a book become emblematic and create recall.

The shortlisted designers will be announced at the Apeejay Kolkata Literary Festival 2020 and an exhibition of the book covers will be displayed at Oxford Bookstore, Connaught Place. The prize will be announced at the Jaipur Book Mark 2020, of Jaipur Literature Festival. The winning entry will be awarded with a prize amount along with a trophy.

Covers of titles by designers of Indian origin and published between April 2018 and March 2019 are invited to apply for the fifth Oxford Bookstore Book Cover Prize. Entries are welcome from the 1st August 2019.

In its first year, the prize was given to designer, **Bena Sareen** for the book, **Talking of Justice** by late author, Leila Seth, published by Aleph followed by designer for the second year **Pinaki De** was declared winner for book **Kalkatta** authored by Kunal Basu, published by Picador India. The third Oxford

Bookstore Book Cover Prize was awarded to **Maithili Doshi Aphale** for the book **Himalaya** authored by Ruskin Bond, Namita Gokhale, published by Speaking Tiger. The fourth Oxford Bookstore Book Cover was awarded to **Bonita Vaz Shimray** for the book **Remnants of a Separation** by Aanchal Malhotra published by Harper Collin.

INTRODUCING THE JURY PANEL

Shobhaa De is an Author, Indian columnist and novelist. De is best known for her depiction of socialites and sex in her works of fiction, for which she has come to be known as the "Jackie Collins of India". She began a career in journalism in 1970, during the course of which she founded and edited three magazines—*Stardust, Society*, and *Celebrity. Stardust* magazine, published by Mumbai-based Magna Publishing Co. Ltd., was started by Nari Hira in 1971 and became popular under the editorship of Shobhaa De. In the 1980s, she contributed to the Sunday magazine section of *The Times of India*. At present, she is a freelance writer and columnist for several newspapers and magazines.

Shobhaa De runs four weekly columns in mainstream newspapers, including *The Times of India* and *Asian Age*. She has been the writer of several popular soaps on television, including India's second daily serial, *Swabhimaan* (first is *Shanti*). De writes Detour, a fortnightly column for The Week. She is the brand ambassador of Dehradun Literature Festival.

Shashi Tharoor is an Indian politician, writer and a former career international diplomat who is currently serving as Member of Parliament, Lok Sabha from Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, since 2009. He also serves as Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on External Affairs and All India Professionals Congress. During the Congress-led UPA Government rule (2004-2014), Tharoor served as Minister of State for External Affairs (2009–2010) and Minister of Human Resource Development (2012–2014). Tharoor is an acclaimed writer, having authored 18 bestselling works of fiction and non-fiction since 1981, which are centred on India and its history, culture, film, politics, society, foreign policy, and more related themes. He is also the author of hundreds of columns and articles in publications such as *The New York Times, The Washington Post, TIME, Newsweek,* and *The Times of India*. He was a contributing editor for *Newsweek International* for two years. From 2010 to 2012, he wrote a column in *The Asian Age, Deccan Chronicle* and, for most of 2012, until his appointment as Minister, a column in Mail Today; he also writes an internationally syndicated monthly column for *Project Syndicate*. He also wrote regular columns for *The Indian Express* (1991–93 and 1996–2001), *The Hindu* (2001–2008), and *The Times of India* (2007–2009).

Feroze Gujral is an Indian philanthropist, art patron, businesswoman, model, columnist, and media personality. She started The Gujral Foundation in 2008 and Outset India in 2010, both dedicated to supporting arts and culture in India. Gujral began her career as a model at the age of 18. She has featured on the multiple covers including Elle and Vogue, and has endorsed luxury brands like She has anchored a television show called Tonight with Feroze. She has been a columnist for Indian Express[CN], Deccan Chronicle[CN] and Vogue (India), a pioneer of TEDx India and curator for TEDx Delhi, and also been a guest lecturer at the National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT). She is on the international board of the Guggenheim Museum in New York, the Serpentine Gallery in London, and the advisory board of IGNCA, New Delhi

Priti Paul is the Director, Apeejay Surrendra Group. Educated at the prestigious Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Harvard University and Architectural Association School of Architecture, UK, Royal Institute of British Architects, Priti Paul has been at the forefront of taking over the business of the century old Apeejay Surrendra Group since 1990. Since then, she has spearheaded the real estate division of the Group which included expanding the business of the Oxford Bookstore in India and abroad, launched India's first gallery on new media art – Apeejay Media Gallery and set up the London Office of Apeejay Shipping Limited.
