Kolkata: Apeejay Shipping has announced the acquisition of a Japanese-built, 76,812MT dead-weight gearless panamax vessel, which will be named 'APJ Indrani'. India's shipbuilding market is estimated to be \$7.1 billion in 2023 and is expected to reach \$8.8 billion in 2028. The global shipbuilding market on the other hand is estimated to grow from \$170 billion to \$230 billion by 2028 at a CAGR of 5.4%. A report stated that India's contribution to commercial shipbuilding globally is less than 1% today, which is far lower than 3.5 % achieved in 2007. It also stated that even with the subsidy the private shipyards are not competitive and stateowned shipyards are content to available defence orders.
